#### NOTE:

1. Students who wish to be admitted into another Faculty's Bachelor Degree Program must successfully complete all of the above eight subjects
2. Students who do not pass ALL of the above eight subjects will be required to remain in the Pathways Program for a third (3rd) semester. The choice of subjects will be decided by the FSD SASQ Manager.

#### On successful completion of these subjects (with no further IELTS requirements) students have the following options:

1. Graduate with a Diploma in University English Studies
2. Transfer to the degree program within Society and Design, Business, Law, Information Technology or Health Sciences & Medicine as noted in your Letter of Offer.
3. Continue with the HS-20027 Bachelor of Arts (EIL) which will require completion of a further 16 Subjects (IF ELIGIBLE)

#### Applying for Credit

Students who complete the Diploma in University English Studies will be eligible for credit towards their chosen program. Subject credits - include the CORE subjects and English subjects credited as electives where allowed.

Credits towards electives for combined degrees may be available and would vary depending on the structure of the combined program. Students seeking credit for electives in a combined program should confirm with the Academic Advisor regarding the number of electives available.
