**Application to Bentley:** Once applicants are nominated through their home university advisor, Bentley will send them an email with login and application instructions. Applications for the Fall semester are due in mid-March. Applications for the Spring semester are due by the end of September.

**Application Requirements:** Students must be nominated by their home university to study on exchange at Bentley University. Students are advised to have a minimum score of 80 on the internet based TOEFL test, or a 7 on the IELTS in order to have the necessary English skills to succeed at Bentley University. These tests are not required for admission.

**Language Courses:** EXP 102 Expository Writing I: Critical Thinking and Writing (for international students), EXP 202 Expository Writing II: Advanced Inquiry in Writing (for international students)

**Full-time Workload:** 12-15 Bentley credits per semester. Most courses are 3 credits each. Bentley students typically take 5 courses for 3 credits each per semester. Exchange students must take a minimum of 4 courses per semester.

**Cost of Program:** This exchange program is tuition-free for non-degree exchange students from partner universities. Students pay fees, listed below.

**Health Insurance:** All exchange students will be required to purchase the Bentley University student health insurance. Students will receive information about their health insurance electronically, and will be automatically enrolled in the insurance program so that it is in effect and students are covered when they arrive at Bentley.

**Course Registration:** Applicants for the fall term will register for courses online in late March-early April. Applicants for the spring term will register for courses online in late October-early November. Bentley will send detailed registration instructions to students well in advance of the course registration period. Occasionally, students need to change or add courses upon arrival at Bentley. A drop/add period lasts throughout the first week of courses.

**Accommodation:** On-campus accommodations are guaranteed for all nominated exchange students. The Residence Center will do their best to place exchange students in the accommodations of their choice. Most exchange students are placed in shared rooms (singles are rarely available). Off-campus housing is an option, but Bentley does not provide assistance in finding off-campus housing; we recommend that students live on campus due to the limited public transportation resources in the area. Bentley University is approximately 12 miles from the city of Boston. We provide regular free shuttle bus service to Harvard Square in Cambridge; the city of Boston lies just over the river from Cambridge and thus is easily accessible.

**Visa:** Upon acceptance, Bentley University issues a **DS-2019** form for all exchange students, which is used to apply for a visa at the US Embassy in the student's home country.

**Facilities**: Exchange students have full access to all resources at Bentley. This includes the cafeterias, library, computer labs, a trading room, the Center for Marketing Technology, the Accounting Center for Electronic Learning and Business Measurement, and other specialized facilities.

Bentley provides a variety of athletic facilities including a pool, weight room, tennis courts, and cardiovascular equipment.
