Terminology:

| Suffixes | Description/Duration of Course |
|-----------|--|
| no suffix | Full course not designated as an essay course (September – April) |
| A | Half course offered in first term (Sept. – Dec.) |
| B | Half course offered in second term (Jan. – Apr.) |
| A/B | Half course offered in first and/or second term (Sept. – Dec./Jan.-Apr.) |
| E | Full essay course (September – April) |
| F | Half essay course offered in first term (Sept.– Dec.) |
| G | Half essay course offered in second term (Jan. – Apr.) |
| F/G | Half essay course offered in first and/or second term (Sept. – Dec./Jan.-Apr.) |

LEC = Lecture. This is when the class meets for lectures.

LAB = Laboratory. If one associated with your course, please select ONE that fits your schedule.

TUT = Tutorial. If one is associated with your course, you **MUST** select it, and list the Course No. with it.

FULL = The course is now full and you will not be able to enroll in it.

*Please note: If a course does not appear in the timetable, it is **not offered** next year.

Course Load:

| Student's Length of Study | Maximum Course Load Per Term | Minimum Course Load Per Term |
|---------------------------|------------------------------|------------------------------|
| One term | 5 courses | 4 courses |

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- Pick courses for BOTH semesters if you're here for full year, not just one term
- Pay careful attention to suffixes so you choose appropriate courses for your term/terms
- The only BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION courses you can take are 2257, 1220, 2299 – all full year courses; however if you are a Business student at your home university, you are able to select courses in the Management and Organizational Studies program
- If you can't find a course description in the link for undergraduate courses, it will probably be a course offered at one of the affiliated university colleges
- Choose a few extra courses in case you are not approved for all of them
