Students must choose four **Postgraduate Law Electives** from the Faculty of Law's offerings.

Students may choose to complete an optional Law Specialisation in one of the following areas:

- <u>Canadian Law and Practice</u>
- <u>Corporate and Commercial Law and Practice</u>
- <u>Dispute Resolution</u>
- International Business and Finance Law

To be eligible for a Law Specialisation, students must complete a minimum of four (4) of their law electives (40 credit points) within one of the above areas. Eligible students may choose to receive a Permissible Award, with the specialisation noted on their Testamur.
