Students must choose Undergraduate Law Electives from the Faculty of Law's offerings.** Students may choose to complete an optional Law Specialisation (40cp) in one of the following areas:

- Legal Practice • International and Comparative Law • Media and Technology Law

To be eligible for a Law Specialisation, students must complete a minimum of four Law Electives (40 credit points) within one of the above areas. Eligible students will receive a Specialisation Certificate at the completion of their Law program.
