<p>Students must choose <a href="#">Postgraduate Law Electives</a> from the Faculty of Law's offerings. No General Electives are offered in this program.</p> <p>In their first semester, it is recommended that students:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• without a solid background in legal research, reasoning or writing enrol in <a href="#">LAWS75-102 Advanced Legal Reasoning, Research and Writing</a>.</li> <li>• from a civil law background enrol in <a href="#">LAWS77-101 Common Law and Legal Skills</a></li> </ul> <p>Students may wish to undertake a specialisation within their degree, by completing four Postgraduate Law Electives (40 credit points) within an approved study area. These include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <a href="#">Canadian Law and Practice</a></li> <li>• <a href="#">Corporate and Commercial Law and Practice</a></li> <li>• <a href="#">Dispute Resolution</a></li> <li>• <a href="#">International Business and Finance Law</a></li> <li>• <a href="#">Family Dispute Resolution</a></li> <li>• <a href="#">International Commercial Law and Dispute Resolution</a></li> </ul> <p>Eligible students may choose to receive a maximum of <u>one</u> optional Permissible Award, with the relevant specialisation noted on their Testamur.</p> <p>Students are able to opt out of a specialisation but must take all Law Electives from the postgraduate offerings in the Faculty of Law.</p>
