A wide range of <u>law electives</u> is offered, with particular emphasis on corporate and commercial law subjects. You may use these subjects to specialise in one particular area, like:

- Canadian Law and Practice

To be eligible for a specialisation, students must complete a minimum of four (4) Law Electives (40 credit points) within one of the above areas. Eligible students will receive a Specialisation Certificate at the completion of their program.
