



## Global Sports Law and Governance

### COURSE OVERVIEW

This course has been designed to take into account the current and emerging issues in global sport and has been designed to deliver a practical and relevant learning experience.

Developed for professionals involved in sport management, the sports industry and legal practitioners interested in sports law, this course will provide an understanding of the key concepts, emerging issues in sports and more.

The course is truly self-paced and designed to provide participants with the flexibility to choose one or more modules. Each module requires approximately 10 hours of reading and participation. Completion certificates are awarded at the end of each module. The method of assessment involves completing an online quiz.

On completion of the course, participants will:

- Gain an understanding of the range of global sports law and governance issues

- Be able to define and describe the legal concepts arising in a global sporting context
- Critically evaluate the effectiveness of law as a regulatory method in global sports law and governance
- Be able to identify by way of cross-jurisdictional review the approaches to sports law issues.

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## Modules

MODULE	DESCRIPTION
<b>Module 1</b> Introducing Key Concepts	This module examines the various definitions and elements in sport, including the unique features of sport as a regulatory domain. This module introduces the role of law in regulating sport.
<b>Module 2</b> Regulation and Governance	This module examines regulation and governance in a general sense, including a review of organisational structures and the hierarchy of rule-making and standard setting in global sport.
<b>Module 3</b> Player Health and Wellbeing	This module examines factors that can impact the health and wellbeing of participants in sport including key challenges associated with managing risks in certain sports.
<b>Module 4</b> Sports Integrity	This module examines foundational concepts involved in sports integrity and considers the regulatory responses of state and non-state actors to mitigate the impact of threats to sports integrity.
<b>Module 5</b> The Olympic Movement	This module analyses the regulatory and governance framework in the Olympic Movement and examines the function of the Court of Arbitration for Sport in dispute resolution in Olympic Sport.
<b>Module 6</b> Emerging Issues in Global Sports	This module examines topical issues in global sports law and regulation such as developments in technology and sport and principles of diversity, equity and inclusion in sports participation.



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
