Student competencies for General Practice Placements

These students have clinical skills in history taking and physical examination including urinalysis. They are competent to take a history from a patient independently. They have not been trained in mental health. Students require supervision to perform any clinical skills other than history taking (if the opportunity arises).

Assessments at <u>Bond</u> will focus on

Clinical General Practice care of patients with a focus on the learning outcomes (as listed above). This includes history, examination, investigation, diagnosis and management of acute and chronic illnesses, as well as the psychosocial interaction with health.

Therapeutics and non-drug interventions of common presentations, eg diabetes, pain, GORD, hypertension, osteoarthritis, depression, anxiety and infections. The indications for medication and the most likely ADRs to occur.

We expect students to see how important it is to learn from doctors and patients in the clinical workplace)
