



Selection Criteria Professor in Public Law

Teaching and Research appointments

1. A doctoral qualification in law.
2. A commitment to excellence and innovation in teaching and learning as evidenced by a well-articulated philosophy of teaching, positive student evaluations, and peer recognition of teaching in the form of, for example, teaching awards and citations.
3. Leadership in curriculum, resource, program and subject design including technology-enabled approaches to subject delivery.
4. A commitment to continuous improvement in teaching practice and performance.
5. A national or international research profile in public law.
6. An extensive record of presentation of research at national and international conferences, publications in quality scholarly journals, participation in academic and public discourse, and other forms of research dissemination.
7. A record of success in applications for research funding and supervision of postgraduate research.
8. A commitment to the continuous development of research skills.
9. Significant and sustained contributions to marketing, recruitment, alumni relations or other service activities within the Faculty and University, including leadership roles on committees, in research centres or in working groups.
10. Excellent leadership, interpersonal, communication and collaboration skills, including an ability to interact effectively with colleagues, students and stakeholders.
