2020 Annual Report - Bond University Rugby

The Bond University Rugby Club continues to be the Club of choice for male and female rugby players on the Gold Coast striving to reach their individual rugby aspirations and to develop these in a holistic and supportive team environment. Our strategy to assist the Gold Coast and Districts Rugby Union (GCDRU) to improve the standard of the competition on the Gold Coast is with a view to having a sustainable development pathway for both Gold Coast rugby players and coaches into the future. This continues to be a major focus of the board as does our relationships with key schools on the Gold Coast where our Coaches are encouraged to be involved as coaches at local rugby schools, thereby also creating pathways for our future players.

In what has turned out to be a very difficult year for all rugby clubs, the QLD Premier Rugby competition was fortunate to start and it is a credit to the administrators of our code that the Premier Rugby Club General Managers, together with the QLD Rugby Union, managed under very trying circumstances to deliver our game in a safe environment, albeit in a shortened format. Despite the disruption caused by COVID-19 to the playing season, the lockdown had a positive impact on our club culture where everyone pulled together to help those who were experiencing mental and financial stress. In many ways this has been a breakout season for our club and in a year of financial difficulty and uncertainty, the Bond University Rugby Club is very proud of the significant milestone of entering a 3rd Grade and a Women's XVs team for the first time in the Club's history. We fielded the following teams in the QLD Premier Rugby Competition, and we hope that our finals performances outlined below are the building blocks for premierships in 2021 and beyond:

Pathway to Premier: Our Pathway to Premier program, established in 2017 for rugby players aged 16 – 18yo, is a skill-based program preparing players for Premier Colts rugby, while playing school and club Rugby locally. There has been significant transition from this program into our Colts Program as well as a number of players transitioning into Senior Rugby with an improved skill level and game understanding.

The inclusion was another significant milestone for the Club which will compliment the development of our Aon7s players, while establishing a new pathway for female Rugby players on the Gold Coast.

It will be an exceptionally long season for the women who have completed the XVs season and seeking selection in our AON7s program.
