

Bond University has one of the most modern and comprehensive film and television facilities in South East Queensland, including high-end cameras, editing stations, audio mixing suites, and a three-camera digital television studio. Students also gain access to the FSD Equipment Loan Store, providing more equipment per student than any other educational facility in Australia. Students can loan a wide range of industry-standard lighting, camera, and sound equipment including cameras, tripods, mobile journalism (mojo) gear, Stedicam video cameras, microphones, field recorders, and drones.
