Study Abroad Program

Undergraduate

(CRICOS course code 108513M)

Successful completion of two semesters of full time study at a recognised higher education institution with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 out of 4.0 or minimum average result of 65%. Academic entry requirements vary by country.

American students	Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5
European students	Minimum of a C grade in European Credit Transfer System (ECTS)
Other international students	Please contact us for further advice
High school leavers and graduates¹	May be eligible and are required to provide their High School Certificate (or equivalent)

English (EAP) + Study Abroad Option

If you do not meet Bond's English Language entry requirements you can receive a packaged offer to study English at Bond before starting your study abroad semester.

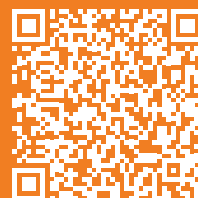
Postgraduate

(CRICOS course code 108514K)

Successful completion of a Bachelor Degree or equivalent

Postgraduate students applying for the study abroad program can study up to a maximum of two semesters. Please check with your home institution's International Office to ensure you meet any other requirements.

Under the Bond system, a standard subject is worth 10 credit points. This generally equates to 7.5 in the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS) or 3-4 credits in the American grading system².
