#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

This postgraduate professional program is designed to develop graduates to be work-ready for careers in nutrition and dietetics across practice areas in Australia and USA including clinical dietetics, private practice, food service management, public health nutrition, sports nutrition and nutrition research. This program develops student competencies to meet the accreditation requirements of Dietitians Australia, making graduates eligible to apply for Accredited Practising Dietitian (APD) status. Students will also develop US-specific competencies to meet the ACEND Foreign Dietitian Education 2022 competency standards. This program is distinctive because of its emphasis on developing evidence-based practitioners that have had intensive preparation in evidence-based dietetic practice, nutrition research and international engagement. All students participate in an international placement (or domestic equivalent) as part of their program.

#### **PROGRAM INFORMATION**

Bond's Master of Nutrition and Dietetic Practice (MNDP) program has full accreditation with Dietitians Australia up until 30 September 2028. Graduates from MNDP program are eligible to become Dietitians Australia members with dietetic qualifications, and to join the Accredited Practising Dietitian (APD) Program. The University is required to maintain a current accreditation status as outlined in Dietitians Australia's accreditation process which can be viewed at dietitiansaustralia.org.au. The Master of Nutrition and Dietetic Practice program has been granted candidacy accreditation as a Foreign Dietitian Education Program (FDE) by the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics (ACEND) of the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics. To become a US Registered Dietitian, graduates will need to complete a program of supervised practice hours in the United States of America prior to being eligible to sit the Registered Dietitian Examination.
