Contemporary Legal Issues

To be eligible for a Law Specialisation, students must complete a minimum of four Law Electives (40 credit points) within one of the above areas. Eligible students will receive a Specialisation Certificate at the completion of their program.

### **Climate Law Major Option**

Students may choose to complete an optional Law Major (60cp) in Climate Law.

To be eligible for a <u>Climate Law Major</u>, students must complete a minimum of six (6) Climate Law subjects (60 credit points).\*\*

### **Legal Innovation and Technology Major Option**

Students may choose to complete an optional Law Major (60cp) in Legal Innovation and Technology.

To be eligible for a Legal Innovation & Technology Major, students must complete a minimum of six (6) Legal Innovation & Technology subjects (60 credit points).\*\*
