SELECTION CRITERIA

Essential

- 1. Current registration with AHPRA as a medical practitioner in Australia.
- 2. PhD or other postgraduate qualification in medical education or other health-related discipline, with a minimum of 5 years of relevant professional practice, ideally integrating both clinical responsibilities and educational leadership.
- 3. Clinically active with demonstrated knowledge of and experience in coordinating and delivering high-quality, innovative teaching and learning of practical clinical skills at the university level, with a strong foundation in contemporary, evidence-based educational methodologies in clinical practice environments.
- 4. Experience in medical education, including effective teaching and academic administration of clinical skills with experience or interest in developing scholarly activity relevant to medical education.
- 5. Experience or ability to engage in curriculum, resource management, timetabling, program and/or subject design in teaching within a medical program including effective strategies and/or experience in facilitating group discussions ideally within a higher education or clinical environment.
- 6. Excellent interpersonal, communication and collaboration skills, with the ability to engage effectively with students, colleagues, and clinical partners across multiple sites, and to work productively within an interdisciplinary academic environment.
- 7. A strong commitment to active involvement in university service and governance activities, including a track record of impactful contributions to committees, working groups and/or accreditation processes that advance academic and institutional objectives.

Desirable

- 1. Evidence of innovation in medical education scholarship for example generating assessments, designing new resources or participating in research.
- 2. Experience in curriculum innovation and development, with proven capabilities in managing academic standards and guiding student progression within a higher education institution.
