## What can students expect?

### Before the program

- Q&A online meeting hosted by the Extension Program Coordinator approximately two weeks before the event

### Day one highlights

- Tour and experience the campus and facilities
- Meet fellow participants, Bond academics and current students
- Complete a Bloomberg data session
- Complete an advanced MS Excel session (Business Stream) or R programming session (Maths Stream)
- Enjoy a session in the Transformer innovation space
- Catering provided (lunch and afternoon tea)

### Day two highlights

- Group project work with fellow students supported by Bond academic staff
- Start and complete written and oral assessment pieces
- Be part of a group presentation to fellow students and academics
- Catering provided (lunch and afternoon tea)

The program will run from approximately 8.30am - 3pm each day. The final timing will be communicated closer to the event.

Parents are warmly invited to join us on day one for a campus tour and lunch with our team. It's a great way to meet the Bond community, ask any questions and explore our learning spaces.
