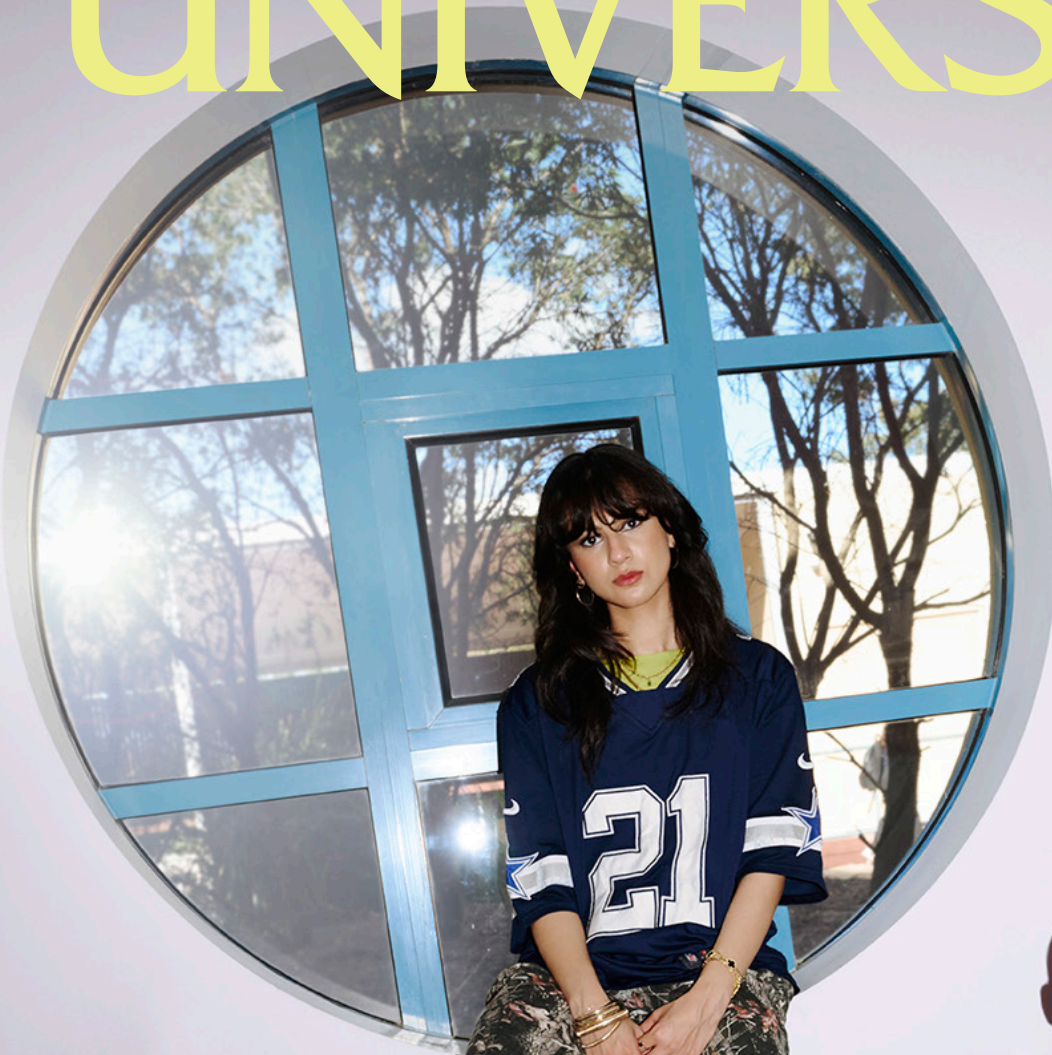

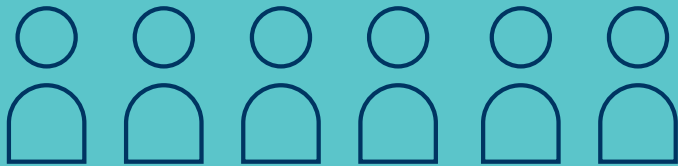

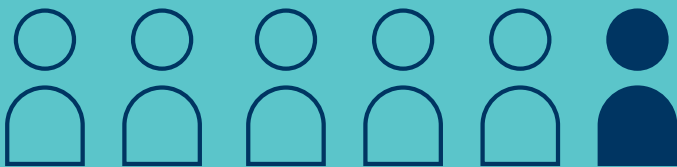

From Bond to Silicon Valley

Bond MBA alumnus and former Google executive Tristan Cameron has carved an unconventional path into the global tech industry — one that began in Bowral in the NSW Southern Highlands and ultimately led to leadership roles in Silicon Valley. After early career experiences spanning Paris, London and Brisbane's public sector, Tristan reached a turning point. Driving past Bond University each day sparked a desire to return to study, and within weeks he started his MBA.

A study abroad semester at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute in New York opened the door to the tech world. Through a 2012 alumni event in New York, he landed a start-up role in San Francisco and then, in 2014, he moved to Google. Over 11 years, Tristan rose to Global Head of Sales Go-to-Market, working across Europe, the Americas, India and Southeast Asia. He credits Google's culture of autonomy, experimentation and rapid decision-making as pivotal to his growth. Among his highlights were supporting fellow Bond graduates and hosting Silicon Valley study tours.

After 14 years in the US, Tristan returned to Australia in 2025 with his wife and young son. Now based in Sydney, he advises tech start-ups, is an angel investor, and is developing breadcrumbX, an AI-powered digital asset management app designed to track key life documents and support families, busy professionals and estate planning.

Tristan believes Australia must urgently strengthen AI education to remain competitive, emphasising curiosity, experimentation and practical skills over traditional résumés. With employers increasingly seeking "AI natives", he says today's students — if they embrace emerging tools — are exceptionally well placed to lead the future of work.

Choose your *postgraduate* path

GRADUATE CERTIFICATE

A graduate certificate can be completed in just one semester full time — four months at Bond. It is a postgraduate credential usually focused on a specific area of study. It typically includes four subjects.

GRADUATE DIPLOMA

A graduate diploma usually includes eight subjects and can be completed in two semesters — or eight months — full time at Bond.

MASTER'S DEGREE

A master's degree is a high-level qualification that can be completed in one to two years full time at Bond. Master's degree graduates demonstrate a strong understanding in a particular area of study. Many master's programs at Bond are accredited with professional organisations.

RESEARCH DEGREE

Higher degree by research is an advanced postgraduate qualification that focuses on independent, original investigation into a specific topic or problem. Unlike coursework degrees, research degrees require students to conduct in-depth research, produce a substantial thesis, and contribute new knowledge to their field.

MICROCREDENTIAL

Microcredentials are professional development short courses designed with industry to provide rapid upskilling in high-demand areas. They are often online and self-paced or may include instructor-led workshops and coaching sessions. Microcredential achievement is recognised with a digital certificate and, in some cases, academic credit towards a postgraduate degree.

EXECUTIVE LEARNING

Executive learning options provide industry professionals with an opportunity to elevate skills and knowledge while also boosting confidence and driving innovation. Bond offers existing courses and bespoke solutions for teams, with flexible online, in-person, and blended learning options available.

Note: For graduate certificate, graduate diploma and master's programs, each subject requires, on average, one two-hour forum and one two-hour tutorial per week. Students should allow approximately six hours per subject per week for at-home preparation, additional reading and assignments — but this will vary from subject to subject.

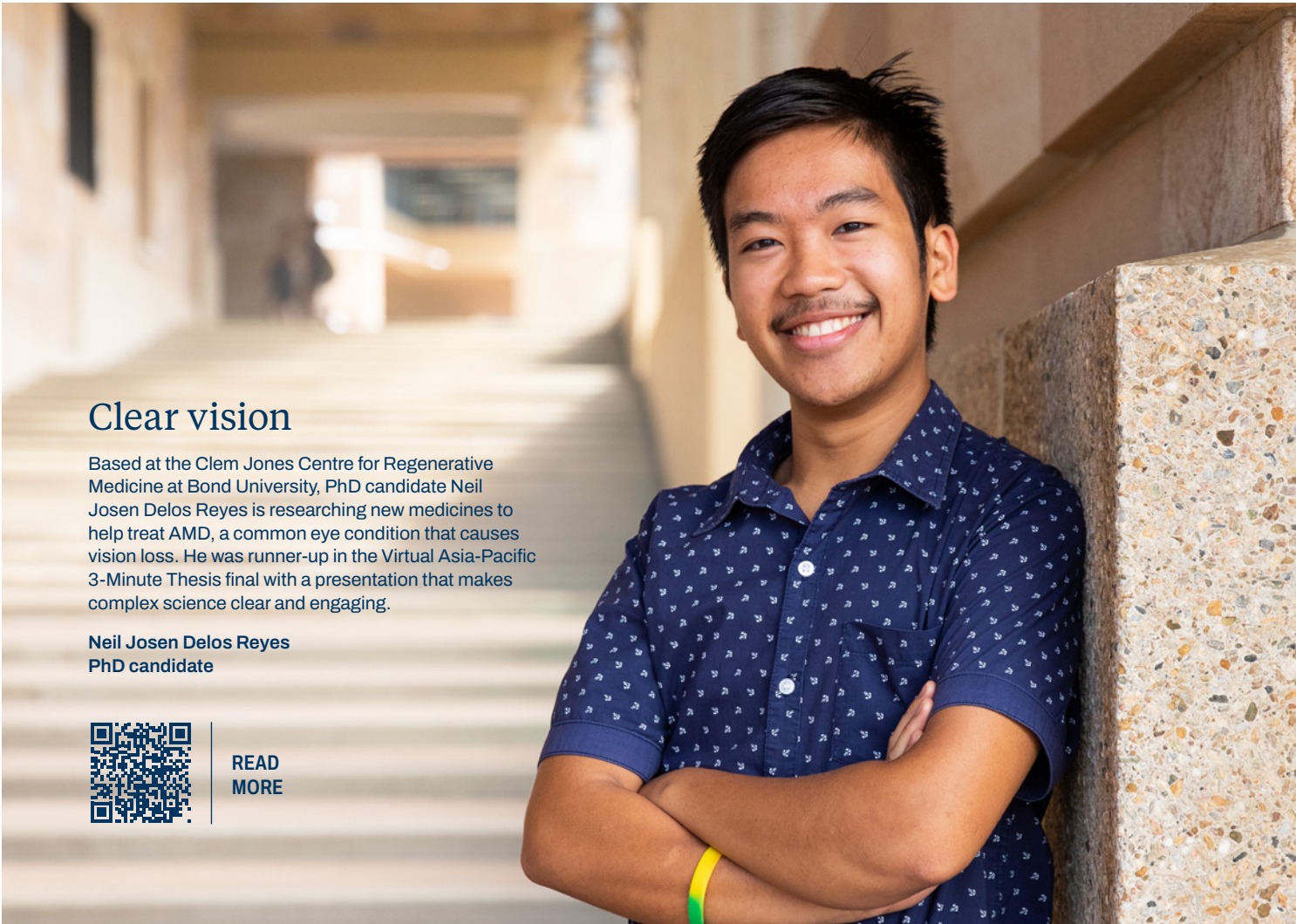

Financing your degree

If you choose to complete postgraduate study at Bond, you can access a number of financing options to support your studies, from the Australian Government's interest-free FEE-HELP scheme, through to loyalty discounts and student funds.

FEE-HELP

FEE-HELP is an interest-free student loan program funded by the Australian Government for all Australian citizens and others who meet the eligibility requirements.

As of 2026, students can borrow up to \$129,883 for any program except medicine, which has a limit of \$186,544. Repayments are made through the taxation system at a minimum rate of 1 per cent per annum when your annual income reaches \$67,000 (2025-2026 financial year). The rate of repayment increases as annual income increases. Indexation is added to a student's HELP debt each year. It is indexed according to the lower of the Consumer Price Index (CPI) or Wage Price Index (WPI).

You can apply for FEE-HELP online using your Student Identification Number once you have received an offer from Bond University.

LOYALTY DISCOUNTS

Bond offers a number of loyalty discounts to students who have a direct family member attending an eligible program at Bond or who have completed an eligible program here. These loyalty programs may provide a reduction of up to 10 per cent on tuition fees.

OTHER GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE

The Department of Social Services has approved a number of master's by coursework programs at Bond for enrolled students who meet all other criteria to receive a Centrelink income support benefit. Find out more at bond.edu.au/income-support.

Psychedelic assistance

In a quiet corner of the Gold Coast, Bond University alumna Shai Hipperson is doing something that would have been unthinkable in Queensland just a few years ago. Her new clinic, Conscious Mind Centre, is the first of its kind in Queensland, and offers something that stands apart from anything most Australians have encountered — psychedelic-assisted therapy, known as Medicine-Assisted Therapy (MAT).

Shai's MAT clients have usually been struggling with severe trauma-based conditions for some time. They've tried talk-based therapy. They've cycled through medications. But still the shadows linger.

"For some people, it's the key that finally opens the door."

MAT drugs aren't the over-the-counter kind. They include, for instance, MDMA or psilocybin — the former more commonly known as ecstasy in its tablet form, the latter being the active compound in so-called "magic mushrooms."

Both have recently been reclassified by Australia's Therapeutic Goods Administration (TGA) to allow prescription for treatment-resistant depression and Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder under strict clinical conditions, via an approved treatment pathway authorised by the TGA and HREC.

Shai (Class of 2022) is one of a small number of trauma therapists in Queensland working alongside approved psychiatrists authorised to prescribe these substances.

The treatment sessions Shai offers are meticulously planned, medically overseen, and paired with deep psychotherapeutic work before, during and after.

"I've seen people make breakthroughs they never thought were possible," she says.

Shai's clinic also offers a full suite of conventional therapies: cognitive behavioural therapy, Eye Movement Desensitisation and Reprocessing (EMDR) and somatic-based interventions. But for a small number of clients, the introduction of MAT has been life-changing.

"Ten years from now, we might wonder why it took us so long," she says.

- Academic transcripts
- Photo identification
- Professional references
- Any other documents required for specific programs

5 SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION

Agree to the application declaration and click 'Submit'. You'll receive an email from Bond University to confirm your application was successfully submitted. The application review process will normally take two weeks, provided all your supporting documentation has been received.
