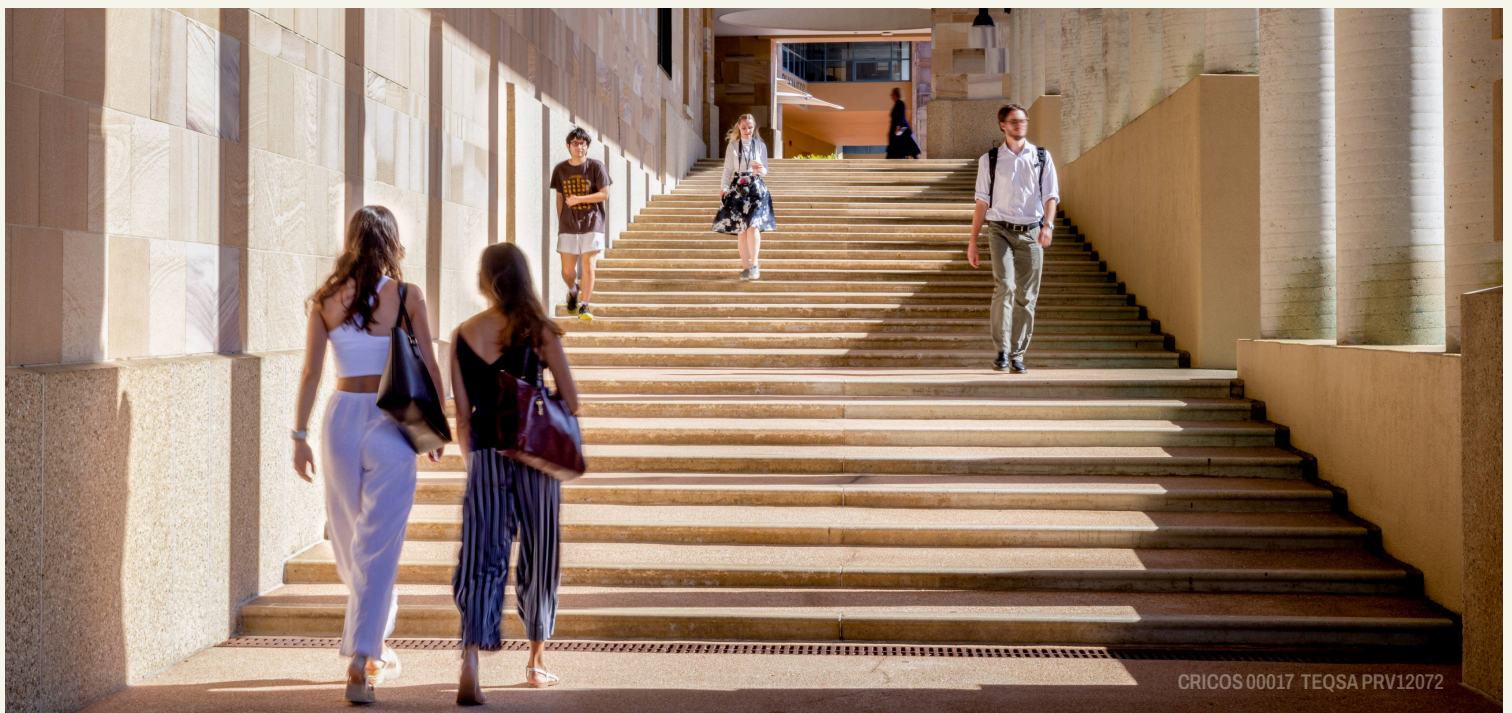

"Part of me always knew I wanted a global career, so I was thrilled to find a course that led me straight there.

I discovered Bond early in my university decision-making process and always felt like I belonged. After thinking deeply about my interests and the impact I wanted to have, I chose to study the Bachelor of International Relations and Bachelor of Laws (Honours) in pursuit of a career as a diplomat.

As an aspiring diplomat, travelling overseas as part of my coursework was a real treat. Our study tours in India, Japan and the United States were so well integrated with the industry that we had meaningful conversations with global leaders, including trade commissioners, non-government organisation spokespeople and ambassadors. From those conversations, we gained an 'inside scoop' we wouldn't otherwise have found in a textbook.

During my studies, I was also able to deliver an address at the United Nations General Assembly Hall podium. My degree has taken me further in 3 years and 4 months than I previously thought I could go in a lifetime. It isn't at every university you can say you have travelled to almost every continent as part of your studies."
