

Three steps to health protection

Please show this document to your doctor to help you complete your health protection tasks.

STEP 1	Request Serology (blood test): <u>Copy of official laboratory report required.</u> All students must request serology for Blood Borne viruses (BBV), at commencement their program. The BBV serology need to be repeated within a 3-year period. 1. Hepatitis B, HIV and HCV (When you receive serology results, complete the NSW Health Blood Borne Virus Student Declaration Form (BBV Form) and upload to Osler) 2. Blood testing for MMR and Varicella will be required in the absence of evidence of TWO vaccinations administered at least one month apart. 3. Serology for immunity to Hepatitis B – Serology showing Anti-HBs $\geq 10\text{mIU/mL}$ is required as well as evidence of a full age-appropriate course of Hepatitis B vaccinations.
STEP 2	Locate your vaccination history from childhood to now: You must provide official medical records (Doctor/Medicare Immunisation records etc.) of your vaccination history for Hep B, Varicella, MMR, COVID, Seasonal Influenza and dTPa. Ensure all records include both your name, DOB and the name of the Immunisation provider clinic/doctor, etc. <u>If records are not in English, they must be officially translated.</u> You can locate your records by: 1. Asking your parents for your baby/childhood records 2. Requesting Immunisation statements from your past and/or present family doctor/s 3. Contacting the Immunisation Registry in your country 4. Requesting school vaccination program records from the local city council or the local public health unit in your school's area. 5. Students vaccinated in Australia can obtain official Immunisation History statement from Medicare through Medicare online or the My Gov platform. If, after trying all above avenues, you have been unable to obtain the required vaccination evidence, please email HSMCompliance@bond.edu.au (Further vaccinations or blood testing for immunity may be required.)
STEP 3	Ensure your vaccinations are up to date 1. Your dTpa vaccination MUST NOT expire <i>during your program</i> - If it is due to expire during your program, you must have a booster vaccine at your initial assessment. The name of the vaccine required is Adacel or Boostrix 2. If your serology is negative/low positive/ borderline or equivocal for Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Varicella and/or Hep B, you will require a booster vaccination from your GP/Pharmacist 3. Evidence of at least ONE Covid vaccination 4. Annual Influenza vaccination – administered in Australia or New Zealand
