The program comprises 16 required subjects, together with 1 Practical Experience subject and 1 General Elective, forming a comprehensive combined-degree structure that integrates advanced sport management expertise with professional project management capability. Delivered across the January, May and September semesters, students progress through a carefully sequenced curriculum that develops deep knowledge of the global sport industry alongside the technical, organisational and strategic skills required to manage complex projects in diverse professional environments. Across the sport management component, students build specialist capability in international sport business, high-performance sport systems, sport law and governance, event management, marketing, finance, risk management, innovation, organisational behaviour, and sport development. This enables graduates to understand the professional challenges and opportunities within the international sporting landscape—from grassroots participation to elite professional sport—and to generate informed, creative solutions for sport organisations and events. The project management component develops professional competence in project planning, procurement, finance, resource management, portfolio and program management, culminating in a substantial research project that integrates conceptual knowledge with applied research and critical thinking. Together, these subjects prepare graduates to oversee major initiatives involving scope, time, cost, risk and stakeholder management, enabling them to access strategic roles within sport organisations and broader project-driven industries.			
Assumed Knowledge			
Assumed knowledge is the minimum level of knowledge of a subject area that students are assumed to have acquired through previous study. It is the responsibility of students to ensure they meet the assumed knowledge expectations of a specified subject. Students who do not possess this prior knowledge are strongly recommended against enrolling and do so at their own risk. No concessions will be made for students' lack of prior knowledge. Please check for all requirements on your subject outline prior to enrolment.

Students may have the opportunity to participate in an international study tour experience or internship as a general elective. Those interested should consult an Enrolment Officer in Student Assist for guidance and to check eligibility requirements (e.g., GPA, language proficiency, prerequisites).

Students also complete a Practical Experience subject—either a Business Internship or Individual Study in Business—along with a postgraduate elective that supports tailored professional development. The combined degree enhances career opportunities for established professionals and provides a strong foundation for individuals aspiring to enter the dynamic and globally connected sport and project management sectors.
