The Bachelor of Commerce (3 Year Program) with an Accounting Major comprises 30 credit points of Core Curriculum Subjects, 90 credit points of Required Subjects, 60 credit points of the Accounting Major, and 60 credit points of General Electives, totalling 240 credit points over six semesters. The program develops advanced capabilities in financial accounting, management accounting, taxation, auditing, financial reporting, accounting information systems, and accounting analytics. Through the Accounting Major, students gain the knowledge and professional competencies required for careers in accounting, auditing, taxation, business advisory, and financial management, while supporting pathways towards CPA accreditation.			
Assumed Knowledge			
Assumed knowledge is the minimum level of knowledge of a subject area that students are assumed to have acquired through previous study. It is the responsibility of students to ensure they meet the assumed knowledge expectations of a specified subject. Students who do not possess this prior knowledge are strongly recommended against enrolling and do so at their own risk. No concessions will be made for students' lack of prior knowledge. Please check for all requirements on your subject outline prior to enrolment.
