The Master of Finance program comprises 60 credit points of Required Subjects, 40 credit points of Finance Options, and 20 credit points of Postgraduate General Electives, totalling 120 credit points across four semesters. Students develop advanced knowledge and skills in finance, financial applications and analysis, corporate finance, portfolio analysis and investments, financial institutions and risk management, and international finance, while tailoring their studies through finance option subjects and postgraduate electives.			
Assumed Knowledge			
Assumed knowledge is the minimum level of knowledge of a subject area that students are assumed to have acquired through previous study. It is the responsibility of students to ensure they meet the assumed knowledge expectations of a specified subject. Students who do not possess this prior knowledge are strongly recommended against enrolling and do so at their own risk. No concessions will be made for students' lack of prior knowledge. Please check for all requirements on your subject outline prior to enrolment.
