The Master of Business (Professional) program comprises 80 credit points of Required Subjects, 45 credit points from a Professional Option (Professional Portfolio or Professional Development), and 40 credit points of Postgraduate General Electives, totalling 165 credit points across five semesters. The program develops advanced capabilities in accounting, economics, finance, management, leadership, marketing, analytics, and professional practice, while providing students with substantial professional experience through an integrated professional development component and the opportunity to undertake an optional specialisation.					
Assumed Knowledge					
Assumed knowledge is the minimum level of knowledge of a subject area that students are assumed to have acquired through previous study. It is the responsibility of students to ensure they meet the assumed knowledge expectations of a specified subject. Students who do not possess this prior knowledge are strongly recommended against enrolling and do so at their own risk. No concessions will be made for students’ lack of prior knowledge. Please check for all requirements on your subject outline prior to enrolment.
