The Master of Business Administration (Professional) program comprises 80 credit points of Required Subjects, a 45 credit point Professional Option (Professional Portfolio or Professional Development), and 40 credit points of Postgraduate General Electives, totalling 165 credit points across five semesters. The program develops advanced capabilities in leadership, strategic decision-making, innovation, data analytics, organisational effectiveness, and business strategy, while providing substantial professional experience through an integrated professional development component and opportunities for elective study or specialisation.			
Assumed Knowledge			
Assumed knowledge is the minimum level of knowledge of a subject area that students are assumed to have acquired through previous study. It is the responsibility of students to ensure they meet the assumed knowledge expectations of a specified subject. Students who do not possess this prior knowledge are strongly recommended against enrolling and do so at their own risk. No concessions will be made for students' lack of prior knowledge. Please check for all requirements on your subject outline prior to enrolment.

Students may have the opportunity to participate in an international study tour experience or internship as a general elective. Those interested should consult an Enrolment Officer in Student Assist for guidance and to check eligibility requirements (e.g., GPA, language proficiency, prerequisites).
