The Master of Sport Management (Professional) program comprises 80 credit points of Required Subjects, a 45 credit point Professional Option (Professional Portfolio or Professional Development), 10 credit points from a Sport Management Option, and 30 credit points of Postgraduate General Electives, totalling 165 credit points across five semesters. The program develops advanced capabilities in sport business, event management, sport law and governance, leadership, marketing, finance, and high-performance sport management, while providing substantial professional experience through an integrated professional development component and opportunities for elective study.			
Assumed Knowledge			
Assumed knowledge is the minimum level of knowledge of a subject area that students are assumed to have acquired through previous study. It is the responsibility of students to ensure they meet the assumed knowledge expectations of a specified subject. Students who do not possess this prior knowledge are strongly recommended against enrolling and do so at their own risk. No concessions will be made for students' lack of prior knowledge. Please check for all requirements on your subject outline prior to enrolment.

Students may have the opportunity to participate in an international study tour experience as a general elective. Those interested should consult an Enrolment Officer in Student Assist for guidance and to check eligibility requirements (e.g., GPA, language proficiency, prerequisites).
