



Selection Criteria

Associate Professor/Assistant Professor Nutrition and Dietetics

1. A PhD (or substantial progress toward a PhD) in a relevant field;
2. Accredited Practising Dietitian (APD) status with Dietitians Australia;
3. Experience in curriculum, resource, program and subject design and delivery in higher education, including contemporary teaching methods such as self-directed learning, web-based learning, small group learning, intensive-mode learning and authentic assessment practices;
4. Evidence of research experience, examples could include participation or leadership in research teams; supervision or co-supervision of higher degree by research students; peer-reviewed publications; a record of success in applications for research funding;
5. Strong interpersonal, communication and collaboration skills, including an ability to engage effectively with students and colleagues within an interdisciplinary environment;
6. Experience in engagement with stakeholders external to the university, including the capacity to liaise and build effective working relationships with healthcare partners and other stakeholders;
7. Demonstrated commitment to marketing, recruitment, alumni relations or other service activities within a university context;
8. **For applications for Associate Professor level, candidates are expected to hold a PhD qualification and demonstrate leadership, management, and team-building capabilities to inspire and support both staff and students, as well as evidence of individual success and excellence in teaching and research.**

Advanced Accredited Practising Dietitian (AdvAPD) recognition and/or being a Registered Dietitian Nutritionist (US/Canada) is desirable.
