Services.

Library Services is pivotal to the University's mission delivering an outstanding library experience through *innovative, personalised services* and *world class learning spaces, resources* and *digital infrastructure*. The Library provides its services through two branch libraries, the *John and Alison Kearney Main and Law Libraries* and through the *Balnaves Foundation Multimedia Learning Centre*.

Faculty Librarians

Each Faculty has a dedicated Faculty Librarian who is responsible for ensuring appropriate resources are available to support learning, teaching and research activities, to provide training to students and staff and to support their information needs.



Research Support

Library Services staff support students and researchers at Bond University with a range of specialised services and resources to assist at every stage of the Research Lifecycle from developing research and reference skills to providing publication impact and data management information.

Personalised Services

Librarians work in close consultation with academic staff and students to provide a highly personalised service to support learning, teaching and research activities.

Library Research Guides

Our online guides provide research assistance and useful resources compiled by subject specialist Librarians. They include 'How to' research and reference guides, 'Subject and Course' information guides, and various 'Topic' guides including Student Wellness, Copyright, and Open Access resources.



Reference Management

Support and training in the use of reference management applications Endnote and RefWorks is available to all students and staff.

Copyright & Intellectual Property

Librarians provide copyright compliance information with in-depth advice and training available through the Manager, Scholarly Publications and Copyright and Faculty Librarians.

Assistance

Ask a Librarian via online chat and e-mail is available for research assistance. Staff and students can book consultation time with specific librarians online.



Resources.

Digital Collections

Explore the Library's open access Collections that contain many historical newsletters and photographs of Bond University, complete series of archived journals, and Bond Research Datasets featuring the Triathlon in Australia and the Exercise & Sport Science Research Methodology collections.

Recreational Resources

The library has a collection of fiction, DVDs, television series, board and console games. Students can borrow or stream from this collection for fun and entertainment.

Resource Lists

Educators, students and librarians can collaborate in the creation, management, and evaluation of readings and other resources that display as a Resource List in iLearn. The Library has developed a guide for educators that covers all the steps for creating and managing a resource list.

The Document Delivery Service attempts to locate and supply items from other libraries anywhere in the world or from commercial document suppliers.

Bond University's *John and Alison Kearney Main Library* provides access to a wide range of resources that support the teaching, research, and learning needs of the University. The library is housed in a contemporary setting with the lakeview room providing spectacular views over the campus.

The John and Alison Kearney Law Library provides a fresh and modern environment that maximizes natural views with flexible study options, consultation spaces, active, collaborative, and silent study areas. A unique feature of the refurbished space is the inclusion of a Moot Court. The library maintains an extensive collection of specialised law resources online and in print for Australian and selected international jurisdictions.




Technology & Spaces.

The Balnaves Foundation Multimedia Learning Centre (MLC) is a technology-rich and architecturally exciting learning environment. It provides over 300 collaborative study spaces and the latest audio visual and computer technology in a spectacular location. Access to study booths and a collaborative learning room with video conferencing facilities are provided together with flexible furniture arrangements to accommodate group work and discussion.

The Studio supports content creation and production, featuring a green screen, HD remote controlled PTZ cameras, 3 point production lighting, a teleprompter and monitors, Apple Mac, quality audio capture and playback facilities and virtual reality (VR) hardware.
