Requirements*	<input type="checkbox"/> Those students with N2 or above (N1 for graduate students) of the Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT) may enroll in classes offered in Japanese in AGU department, subject to the professor's consent after an online interview in Japanese and a placement test. (Students are required to submit a JLPT certificate). Moreover, if the students with N2 or above hope to study Japanese language at the CJLC, they may be allowed in the CJLC with the professor's consent. <input type="checkbox"/> Those students who are at beginner level of Japanese but can communicate in English will belong to the Center for Japanese Language and Culture (CJLC) and take the classes offered by the CJLC, and the classes available in English offered by various departments of AGU. <input type="checkbox"/> Students must be nominated and approved by the department in charge of exchange program and the president of their home university.

Application Procedure	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. The Center for International Programs (CIP) at AGU receives email from partner universities with details of nominated student(s).</li> <li>2. Email response with AGU exchange application form is sent to partner universities.</li> <li>3. Student(s) then fill out the application form and send it back to AGU by email.</li> <li>4. Once the application is submitted, it will be assessed within 1-2 month(s).</li> <li>5. Student(s) will be notified of their application outcome by email.</li> <li>6. AGU will issue Confirmation of Enrollment.</li> <li>7. Approved student(s) must then fill out an Application for Certificate of Eligibility sent by AGU and send it back to AGU by email.</li> <li>8. AGU applies to Immigration Bureau for the issuance of an authorized "Certificate of Eligibility (CoE)".</li> <li>9. Once CoE is issued, AGU will send it with a Confirmation of Enrollment to student(s).</li> <li>10. Student(s) will then apply for visa at the Japanese embassy, consulate or equivalent institution.</li> </ol>

Transcripts	Transcripts will be sent to partner universities in early September (Spring Semester), or in early March (Fall Semester).

### 3. Other Information

Accommodation	<b>Apartment</b> AGU will arrange an apartment room within walking distance of AGU campus.

Health Insurance	Every international student who lives in Japan for over three months is required to enroll in the National Health Insurance system. Subscribers to the system pay 30 percent of the medical expenses at a clinic or hospital for any medical and dental treatment covered by the system. (Insurance premium: about ¥2,000/month)
Bank Account	CIP recommends exchange student(s) to open an account at Japan Post Bank (ATM is located on Nisshin campus).

\*CIP staff or AGU student tutors will help exchange student(s) to take necessary procedures for above matters.

### 5. Facilities on Nisshin Campus

Health Center	Weekdays 9:00-17:30	This health care facility consists of a medical center, a consulting center, and a dental clinic. It is staffed by physicians, surgeons, dentists, and professional counselors.
AGU Sports Center	Weekdays 10:00-19:45 Sat 9:00-12:00	The center includes an indoor heated swimming pool, a workout gym, multi-purpose rooms, and other sporting facilities. It is open to all students for an annual fee of 2,000 yen.
Indoor Pool	Weekdays 10:00-16:00	The 25-meter indoor heated swimming pool at the Sports Center caters to games and competitions and is also open for general student use.
Library	Weekdays 9:00-20:00	The library holds a collection of over a million books and boasts a reading space of 1,500 seats in total.
Computer Center & Labs	Weekdays 9:20-18:20	The Education Center for Information Processing (ECIP) is equipped with computers, with the latest software and peripherals, to ensure quality training in information processing.
Administration Center	Weekdays 8:50-17:45	This building houses the two offices that support students in many aspects: The Registrar, a place for course registration and other procedures, and the Student Affairs Office, which handles the issuance of various documents and academic counseling.
Zen Meditation Hall	-	The Zen Meditation Hall, built as the first official Zen hall at a university in Japan, attracts many practitioners from inside and outside the university.
